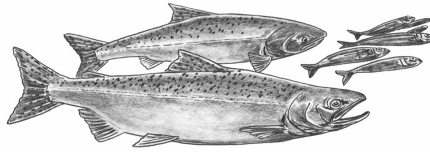


# 2013 Sawyer Property Planting

## **Project Summary**

**Number of trees planted:** 175

**Number of Crew Members:** 6

**Length of stream planted:** 140 ft. with a 20ft buffer (total area= 2,800 sq. ft.)

This property is located along Chimacum Creek. The site's predominant vegetation was filled with invasive species such as reed canary grass and patches of blackberries; providing minimal shade and habitat for ESA listed Hood Canal Summer Chum and Coho salmon.

Sawyer was on board for a planting after participating in a Landowner Workshop; she learned that NOSC does plantings, invasive removal, and maintenance with no cost to the landowner.

## **Sawyer Property Planting April 15, 2013**

The Washington Conservation Corps crew planted 175 trees and shrubs along a 140 ft. section of Chimacum Creek owned by Sarah Sawyer. Site prep included removal of Himalayan Blackberry and Reed Canary Grass. The site will continue to be maintained by a NOSC maintenance crew to ensure ultimate survival of the shrubs planted. NOSC would like to thank the landowner, Sarah Sawyer, for kindly allowing NOSC to plant on her property.
