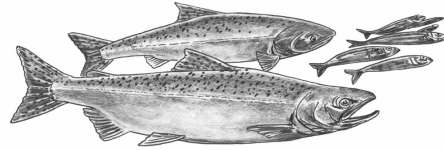


2003 Amdal East Chimacum Creek Restoration



Why was restoration needed?

On this private stretch of East Chimacum Creek, the creek had lost channel complexity, large woody debris, floodplain capacity and riparian shade, factors that reduce salmon productivity in this watershed.

Project Overview

Location: E. Chimacum Creek- Amdal Prop.

This portion of E. Chimacum Creek is part of a joint effort to restore 1800' of East Chimacum Creek back to salmon friendly habitat. A rock weir was installed to help dissipate energy and provide habitat for out-migrating coho salmon. The project is expected to increase dissolved oxygen and reduce summer stream temperatures by providing riparian shade through volunteer plantings.
