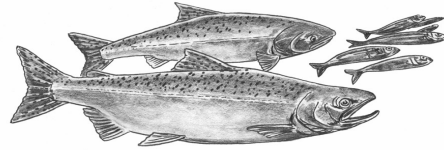


# 2007 Forest Service Road 3040 Decommissioning



## Why was restoration needed?

Since the 1940's Deep Creek and East and West Twin Rivers have been subject to mass wasting and sediment from an inactive logging road, FS 3040, in the Olympic National Forest. High levels of sediment input in a stream system can choke out salmon spawning habitat and lead to aggradation of the stream bed.

## Project Overview

Location: FS 3040- Olympic National Forest- Deep Creek and East and West Twin Watersheds

Miles of road decommissioned: 11 miles

The decommissioning of FS road 3040 in the Olympic National Forest took place between milepost 7.2 to milepost 13.2 and all the spur roads on this road. This is a total of 11 miles of road. NOSC secured a SRFB grant in 2006 to pass thru funding to the Forest Service to begin decommissioning of this road. This road passes through three watersheds that contain populations of coho, fall chum and winter steelhead.
