2020-2021 Project Themes

RESILIENCE: Our communities are often at risk to natural processes like flooding, wildfires, and rivers that move. By working with partners, we find on-the-ground solutions that serve the goals of both our communities and our salmon.

RURAL ECONOMIES: RFEG construction projects employ local businesses to provide a wide range of family-wage jobs, including heavy equipment operators, truckers, accountants, landscape architects, biologists, planners, and engineers.

LOCAL RESPONSIVENESS: Being community-based, RFEGs quickly address threats and embrace opportunities. RFEGs are nimble, local organizations that often form strategic partnerships to tackle emerging issues.

2020-21 Funding: State & Federal Dollars Matched 1:8

State and federal RFEG funds – administered by WA Department of Fish and Wildlife and the US Fish and Wildlife Service – provide seed money, helping us take projects from ideas into action, bring together partners, write grants, and train staff. We further leverage this funding, securing an additional \$8 for every \$1 received, greatly amplifying the initial investment.
